TEACH NORTH TEXAS

(JOINT PROGRAM OF THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES AND COLLEGE OF EDUCATION)

The Teach North Texas program at the University of North Texas (UNT) invites applications for a full time, 9-month lecturer position to serve as a Master Teacher. The position begins in Fall 2010. Annual reappointment is expected contingent upon satisfactory performance. Applications are accepted on-line at facultyjobs.unt.edu/applicants/Central?quickFind=50707.

Teach North Texas is an undergraduate secondary mathematics, science, and computer science teacher education program being implemented at UNT as one of 15 national UTeach replication sites. Experienced secondary teachers work with UNT faculty in design and delivery of an innovative, highly visible program.

Applicants must have a minimum of a master's degree with significant content in mathematics and/or science, and at least three years of secondary public school teaching experience. Applicants must have demonstrated excellence in teaching and interest in teacher education. Desired qualifications include supervision of student teachers, college teaching or similar experiences, contacts with schools and school districts in Region XI, and leadership in curriculum or professional development in their content area(s).

Duties of Master Teachers include teaching courses in the professional development sequence for pre-service teachers in mathematics, science and computer science; coordination of field and clinical experiences to include orientation of mentor teachers and supervision of TNT students in the field, and building community among TNT students, faculty, and school personnel.
