POSITION: Tenure track Assistant Professor or Tenured Associate Professor in Mathematics Education

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Wisconsin-Madison is seeking a tenure track Assistant Professor or a tenured Associate Professor in the area of Mathematics Education. The University of Wisconsin-Madison is dedicated to a program of excellence and leadership in Mathematics Education. The University currently is home to the Wisconsin Center for Education Research (WCER); the NSF Teaching and Learning Center: Diversity in Mathematics Education (DiME); the NSF Partnership: Systemwide Change for all Learners and Educators (SCALE); and the NSF Center for the Integration of Research, Teaching, and Learning (CIRTL). Faculty are engaged in active programs of research and professional development that support and provide research apprenticeships for 12 or more full time Ph.D. students. Research is integrated with teaching and curriculum development such that it plays a critical role in providing a focus for the development of innovative programs for undergraduate and graduate teacher education. Assistant Professor

2. A record of success in competing for external funding.
3. Evidence of excellence in teaching.
4. Experience teaching at the elementary, middle or secondary level; and with diverse populations are desirable.
5. An earned doctoral degree in mathematics education (or a closely related area).

RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Teach graduate and undergraduate courses in mathematics education.
2. Advise graduate and undergraduate students.
3. Engage in an active program of research and scholarship.
4. Provide leadership at the national, state, and university levels.
5. Collaborate with other faculty to maintain a program of leadership and excellence in research and teaching.
6. Provide service to the university, public, and profession.

RANK AND SALARY:

Assistant Professor: Salary is open and will be negotiated on the basis of the applicant's experience and qualifications. The initial contract is three years.

Tenured Associate Professor: Salary is open and will be negotiated on the basis of the applicant's experience and qualifications.
